The City Council requested Staff prepare data and information on the following topics to be discussed on Friday, August 6:

• Personnel: Compensation data, definition of a merit increase and cost of living adjustment and the difference of each. If an increase is proposed, how much would it cost, how does the Town compare to our comparable cities and how would it affect the tax rate or fund balance? Staff advised that a market study was scheduled but postponed. Compensation

- and Classification Study was last accomplished in 2017; and
- Tax Rate: Increase or lower this year? Adopt a no-new revenue tax rate? Lower the interest and sinking portion of the tax rate and fund balance. Provide results of changes to tax rate and fund balance show adjustments for discussion.
